About CCPR

The Chin Center for Peace and Reconciliation (CCPR) is a Chin-led peacebuilding and governance organization working in Chin State and along the Myanmar-India border. CCPR works with local communities and civil society structures to advance protection, governance, and durable peace in Chin State.

Background

CCPR is currently working on a civilian protection and humanitarian program in Chin State, covering 12 villages across four townships: Thantlang, Hakha, Falam, and Tedim. The program includes community training on first aid, EORE (Explosive Ordnance Risk Education), and emergency preparedness. The Civil Engineer holds overall technical responsibility for construction across all four townships.

Key Responsibilities

Construction oversight & technical quality

- Supervise construction activities across all four target townships (Thantlang, Hakha, Falam, Tedim), ensuring full compliance with the approved bill of quantities (BOQ) and technical design.
- Select or verify construction sites based on safety, soil stability, and accessibility for schoolchildren.
- Conduct site inspections in three phases per location: pre-construction site assessment, mid-construction structural inspection, and final evaluation upon completion.
- Verify structural integrity and safety compliance at each site, including installation of safety netting and provision of safety gear (helmets, boots, gloves) for construction workers.
- Oversee procurement and transport of locally available construction materials, maintaining quality and cost-effectiveness.

Project coordination & stakeholder engagement

- Coordinate directly with the Assistant Engineer, who is responsible for day-to-day supervision in Falam and Tedim townships, to maintain a consistent construction standard across all four townships.
- Liaise with school committees, village leaders, and local governance bodies to ensure community ownership of project activities.

Safety & capacity building

- Ensure all project activities uphold humanitarian principles, including Do No Harm, safeguarding, and prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse (PSEA).

Reporting & documentation

- Report construction progress, quality issues, and delays to the relevant project officers on a regular basis.
- Maintain inspection records and photographic documentation to support project reporting.
- Prepare a construction quality checklist and completion certificate for each shelter upon completion.

Qualifications and Experience

- Bachelor's degree in civil engineering or a closely related field.
- Demonstrated experience supervising construction projects, ideally in remote or conflict-affected settings.
- Familiarity with Chin State terrain, access constraints, and local construction practices is an advantage.
- Willingness and ability to travel frequently to project sites across four townships, including areas with limited infrastructure.
- Working proficiency in Chin (Hakha or relevant dialect) and Burmese; English an advantage.

Other Competencies

- Strong interpersonal, communication, and coordination skills.
- Upholding and promoting the highest standards of respect, honesty, integrity, and ethical conduct.
- Ability to work independently with minimal supervision and take initiative where needed.
- Commitment to CCPR's mission, including safeguarding, prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse (PSEA), and Do No Harm principles.
- Flexibility to travel frequently to field locations under challenging circumstances.
